

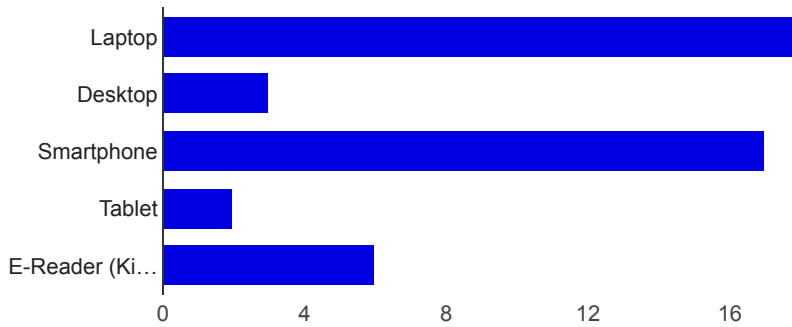

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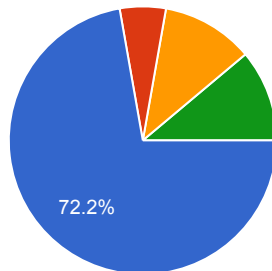

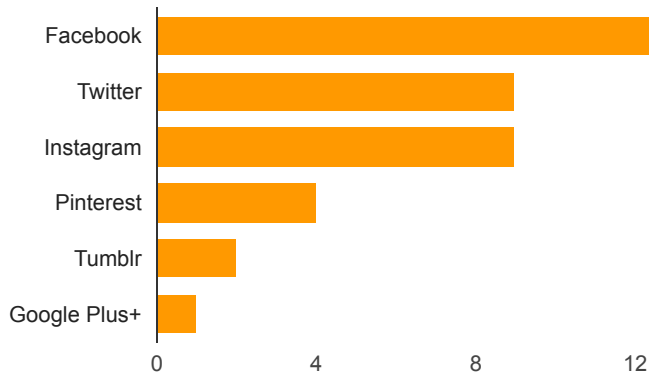
What web browser do you use most frequently?

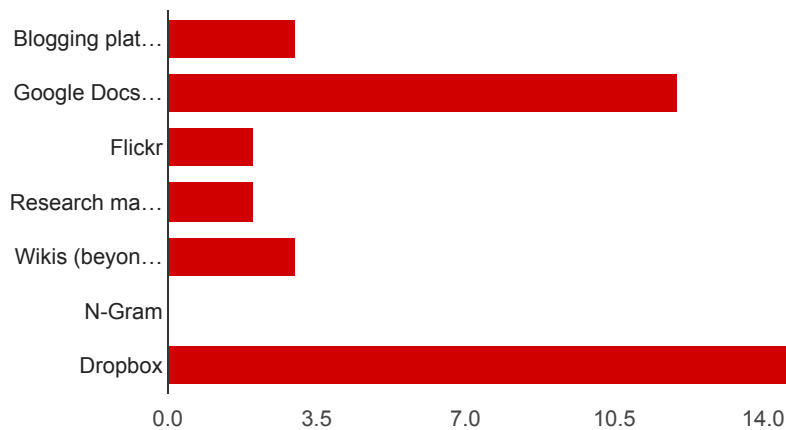

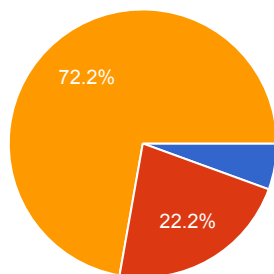

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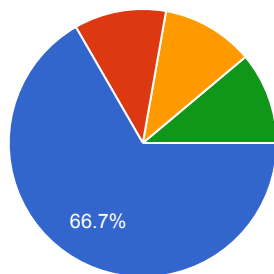

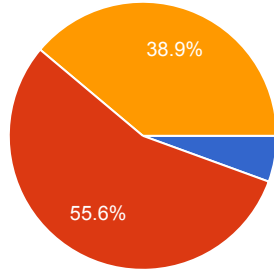
When you have a technical question about a digital tool, service, or system, what is the first thing you usually do to answer your question?
